

MEETING THE CHALLENGES CLIMATE CHANGE PRESENTS TO SCOTLAND'S HISTORIC ENVIRONMENT

17th & 18th of November 2011 FYVIE CASTLE, FYVIE, ABERDEENSHIRE

On Thursday the 17th & Friday the 18th of November 2011, the Scottish Traditional Skills Training Centre is presenting a two-day education/training programme directed towards providing participants with highly useful information, as well as practical advice and guidance, concerning the interventions required in order to meet the Challenges Climate Change Presents to Scotland's Historic Environment.

The course, which will be held at The National Trust for Scotland's Fyvie Castle in Aberdeenshire, will incorporate presentations by a range of leading authorities from throughout the country, who possess in-depth knowledge and understanding of this critically important, yet often confusing and misunderstood subject.

Those attending will include representatives of Conservation Organisations, Local Authority Planning Departments and other Public Bodies, as well as Community-based Organisations, Private Individuals and Professionals involved in the conservation, repair and maintenance of Scotland's built and landscape heritage.

As support for the development and delivery of the programme has been received from The Scottish Government's Climate Challenge Fund and Historic Scotland, as well as a Private Sector sponsor, we will <u>not</u> be charging a fee for those attending the 2 days.
