# **How to get to Glencruitten House:**

Glencruitten House is approximately 2 miles from the centre of Oban. From the town centre, take the A816 south, then take the left fork into Glencruitten Road (at Kilmore and Oban Church). Follow Glencruitten Road up the hill and then to the right through the golf course. Continue as it bends left then right under the railway bridge, and the entrance to Glencruitten house is about ½ a mile further, on the right.
