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How about *being* the change we wish to see in the world?

As I write (in late spring) I have compiled ideas for a simple, adaptable fellowship meal, using seasonal ingredients and aimed at drawing people together, whether informally on a picnic (taking flasks and mugs), at a Harvest Supper or perhaps as mindful eating which could be part of a complete liturgy. You could use parsley, leeks, and other seasonal additions rather than stinging nettles and (responsibly harvested) wild garlic!

There are so many stories of sharing in the New Testament (see, for example, Acts 4:34). Embarking on this path we are in good company.

Celebrating all that's wholesome, cultivating gratitude and a renewed sense of wonder – these are the aspirations behind the cooking and sharing illustrated in the link below.

Included is the idea of making a grace-cube, perhaps using an upcycled cardboard box. I saw this idea at a Retreat House.

The presence of God, Source and Creator, is always a reality. Regular, intentional practices of thanksgiving, slowing down, celebrating the Holy in the 'ordinary' are challenges for these weeks of Creation tide.
